Alexander Palm

Botanical Name: Ptychosperma elegans

Comments: Lovely smaller scale palm, eventually growing to 20'. Sun to part shade; self-cleaning. Works in smaller spaces because of smaller head.



Areca Palm

Botanical Name: Dypsis lutescens

Comments: Clustering palm, meaning many trunks spring up from same base. Grows 15'-20'; often used as a privacy screen.



Dwarf Sugar Palm

Botanical Name: Arenga engleri

Comments: Short, wide-growing multi-trunk palm. Slow growing to about 8'. Dense palm; can be used for screening.



Bamboo Palm or Parlor Palm

Botanical Name: Chamaedorea elegans

Comments: Slow growing, airy looking palm for shade. Great container plants.



Bismarck Palm

Botanical Name: Bismarckia nobilis

Comments: Beautiful silver color; needs lots of space. Somewhat susceptible to Palmetto weevil infestation which can be lethal. This palm can overwhelm a home landscape; more often used in common areas. Bismarck palm is planted on either side of the north entrance.



Cabbage Palm

Botanical Name: Sabal palmetto

Comments: State tree of Florida. Can specify 'crooked or curved', 'slick' or 'booted' in describing the trunk. Widely planted in the Isles.



Chinese Fan Palm

Botanical Name: Livistona chinensis

Comments: Wide spreading crown; eventually growing to 25' in height. Slow growing. Beautiful palm; may be better suited to large landscapes.



Cat Palm

Botanical Name: Chamaedorea cataractarum

Comments: Clustering palm with no trunk. Slow growing to 6-8 feet in sun or shade. Works well in large containers. Needs regular water.



Christmas Palm

Botanical Name: Adonidia merrillii

Comments: Slow growing to 12'-15'; protected location is best; self-cleaning. Beautiful smaller palm. Planted on numerous homeowner properties and as understory palms at the Aviano entrance.



European Fan Palm

Botanical Name: Chamaerops humilis

Comments: Compact, very slow growing to 8'-10'; sun or shade. High drought tolerance; low maintenance. Works in containers as well.



Foxtail Palm

Botanical Name: Wodyetia bifurcata

Comments: Fast growing to 30'; beautiful full, rounded fronds. Low maintenance (self-cleaning). Planted on the north end of Burgos Drive.



Lady Palm

Botanical Name: Rhapis excelsa

Comments: Relatively small scale palm for shade or part shade; multiple thin trunks. Suitable for containers; Asian look.



Pygmy Date Palm

Botanical Name: Phoenix roebelenii

Comments: Single stem or cluster to 12'; full to part sun. Widely used in the Isles.



Queen Palm

Botanical Name: Syagrus romanzoffiana

Comments: Fast growing to 40'; sun to part sun. Can be susceptible to lethal fungal disease. Widely planted in the Isles.
