Black Olive, Shady Lady

Botanical Name: Bucida buceras 'Shady Lady'

**Comments**: Beautiful smaller scale shade tree with dark green leaves. Layered branched tiers gives it a somewhat Asian feel. Small yellow flowers in the spring; non-fruiting. Some of these trees were damaged or destroyed during hurricane lan.



Cassia

**Botanical Name:** Cassia surattensis

**Comments**: Yellow flowers in spring and fall; fast growing to 12"-15'. Susceptible to wind damage. Originally planted as a street tree on Burgos Drive but were not long lived. Removed after a slow decline and strong wind damage.



**Crape Myrtle** 

**Botanical Name:** Lagerstroemia indica

**Comments:** Numerous cultivars from small shrub to tree; use disease and mildew resistant cultivars. Best in sun; exfoliating bark on some cultivars adds year round interest. Select cultivar to suit location.



Holly, Eagleston

**Botanical Name:** Ilex x attenuata 'Eagleston'

**Comments**: 15'-25' in height; takes shaping well. Red berries. Dahoon holly (Ilex cassine) is another good holly for the area; smooth, shiny dark green leaves; takes pruning well.



**Holly, Nellie Stevens** 

Botanical Name: Ilex x 'Nellie R. Stevens'

Comments: One of the best large growing hollies for Florida landscapes; berries.



Holly, Weeping

Botanical Name: Ilex vomitoria 'Pendula'

**Comments**: Generally irregularly shaped but can prune to maintain desired shape. Unique accent tree, small leaves, red berries on female.



Jacaranda

Botanical Name: Jacaranda mimosifolia

**Comments**: Beautiful purple flowers in spring; fast growing to 40'. Best suited to medium – large yards.



Japanese Blueberry

**Botanical Name:** Elaecarpus decipiens

Comments: Slow growing broad leaf evergreen; good substitute for hollies. Pyramidal. Often used

as topiary.



Magnolia

Botanical Name: Magnolia grandiflora 'Alta'

**Comments**: Signature evergreen of the south with large fragrant flowers in the spring. Both 'Alta' and 'Brackens Brown Beauty' are more narrow that the species. 'Little Gem' is a smaller variety with smaller leaves and growth habit. A number of the 'Little Gem' have struggled in the Isles.



Poinciana

Botanical Name: Delonix regia

**Comments**: Large, fast-growing deciduous tree with fine textured foliage and dramatic red-orange flowers. Wide- spreading so allow room for growth.



**Weeping Bottlebrush** 

Botanical Name: Callistemon viminalis

Comments: Lovely soft-textured tree with red brush-like flowers. Moderate growth to 25'-30'.
